

Gift aid:

What is Gift Aid?

Put simply its FREE money from HMRC for charities such as the Scout Association.

Gift Aid for Scouts allows our group to claim 25p for every £1 donated by UK taxpayers, and this includes the subscription fees from Parents.

This costs you nothing, other than you filling in a form, & this is a very easy way of us raising funds.

As a group we currently raise about £500 a year through gift aid, but if all parents signed up to this, the amount would almost double. If you have not completed and returned your gift aid form, then please ask a leader for a form.
